PROCLAMATION

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME – GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: Crosswalk Safety Awareness Day in Arkansas was created 14 years ago in Fayetteville in an effort to protect pedestrians and motorists from harm at crosswalks; and

WHEREAS: In 2015, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), there were 5,376 pedestrians killed by motorists in the United States, and 43 of these were Arkansans; and

WHEREAS: Approximately every 98 minutes, a pedestrian is killed in our country from injuries caused by a traffic accident, and pedestrians are injured every 7.5 minutes by a vehicle on a public traffic way; and

WHEREAS: By law, drivers are required to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians crossing streets in marked or unmarked crosswalks in most situations; however, pedestrians need to be especially careful at intersections where the driver is turning onto another street, as many drivers fail to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians in their paths; and

WHEREAS: Pedestrians are encouraged to cross the street at designated crosswalks, to stop and look left, right, and left again before crossing, to increase visibility at night by carrying a flashlight and by wearing retro-reflective clothing, and to walk on a sidewalk whenever possible;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ASA HUTCHINSON, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of Arkansas, do hereby proclaim October 11th, 2017 as

CROSSWALK SAFETY AWARENESS DAY

across the State, and I urge my fellow citizens in schools, homes, and offices to discuss crosswalk safety because increasing awareness for safety is positive prevention.
