**PROCLAMATION**

EO 20-47

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME GREETINGS:

**AN EXECUTIVE ORDER TO PROVIDE FUNDING FROM THE HAZARD MITIGATION DISASTER FUND**

WHEREAS: It is essential for the State to implement an effective hazard mitigation program to address the effects of future disasters that may fall upon local governments and to allow state business to be conducted in an efficient and orderly manner; and

WHEREAS: Mitigation measures to prevent future damage to public facilities are necessary to ensure the welfare of the citizens of the State of Arkansas.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ASA HUTCHINSON, Governor of the State of Arkansas, acting under the authority vested in me by Ark. Code Ann. § 12-75-101, *et. seq.*, as amended, do hereby authorize the use of Hazard Mitigation funds for the following Hazard Mitigation projects:
