TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME – GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI) is a genetic disorder characterized by fragile bones that break easily. It is also known as brittle bone disease. A person is born with this disorder and is affected throughout his or her lifetime; and

WHEREAS: Because there is no cure for OI, treatment focuses on minimizing fractures, the surgical correction of deformity, reducing bone fragility, maximizing mobility and independent function; and

WHEREAS: Increased funding for education and research are needed to help find more effective treatments; and

WHEREAS: The Osteogenesis Imperfecta Foundation is declaring May 2<sup>nd</sup> through May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2015 to be National Osteogenesis Imperfecta Awareness Week; and

WHEREAS: Board members, staff, medical professionals and volunteers are joining together to focus attention on OI in an effort to increase awareness;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ASA HUTCHINSON, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of Arkansas, do hereby proclaim May 2 through May 9, 2015, as
