PROCLAMATION

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME – GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: Tourette Syndrome (TS) is an inherited disorder characterized by uncontrollable movements and sounds, called “tics,” that can strike people of all ethnic and racial backgrounds, with males affected three-to-four times more often than females; and

WHEREAS: TS symptoms generally appear before the age of ten. Unfortunately, many children are not diagnosed immediately due to lack of information and understanding of this disorder – four years is the average time between onset of symptoms and diagnosis; and

WHEREAS: One of the most difficult aspects of this condition is the lack of public awareness and the unjustified and unfortunate reactions to patients with this disorder; and

WHEREAS: TS is often accompanied by other disorders such as obsessive-compulsive disorder and/or attention deficit disorder, complicating treatment and making it difficult to lead a productive life; and

WHEREAS: Each year, the Tourette Association of America recognizes May 15 through June 15 as Tourette Awareness Month. Affiliated chapters of TSA, and other organizations across the country, embark on campaigns to educate the public, healthcare professionals and educators about this underdiagnosed, and often misunderstood, neurological condition;


