**PROCLAMATION**

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME – GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: Herbert Jack Lloyd, born on November 27, 1936 in Hope, Arkansas, was a retired United States Army Brigadier General, deeply loved by his family and many friends and died December 10, 2015; and

WHEREAS: During his time of military service he served two tours in Germany and three tours in Vietnam concluding his active duty service as Assistant Division Commander, Second Infantry Division in Korea. During his time with the Army he received twelve awards for valorous service. He was also inducted into the Arkansas Military Veterans and U.S. Army Ranger Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS: Bearing in mind that it is fitting and proper to recognize those who served above and beyond the call of duty, Arkansas recognizes with pride the life of native son, Herbert Jack Lloyd, and honors his life as an example of the highest levels of duty to country and service to mankind; and

WHEREAS: Arkansas grieves with all Americans, and indeed the people of the world, who mourn the immeasurable loss of a noble hero; and

WHEREAS: The citizens of this State and Nation extend their deepest sympathy to the family and loved ones of Brigadier General Herbert Jack Lloyd; and

WHEREAS: All Arkansans and United States citizens owe Brigadier General Lloyd a lasting debt of gratitude for his bravery and his heroism and should pay tribute to his faithful service;


