

PROCLAMATION

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME - GREETINGS:

- WHEREAS: Arthrogryposis Multiplex Congenita (AMC) is a condition that causes many joints to be stiff and crooked at birth. A newborn with arthrogryposis lacks the normal range of motion in one or more joints. This condition develops prenatally and can be caused by an underlying condition or syndrome; and
- WHEREAS: Arthrogryposis Multiplex Congenita is an umbrella diagnosis, meaning that it is a part of many other conditions and syndromes. There are over 400 different types of AMC of which Amyoplasia, Distal Escobar Syndrome is the most common; and
- WHEREAS: A newborn has to have three contracted joints in two different body areas to be diagnosed with arthrogryposis. This occurs in every 1 in 3,000 births; and
- WHEREAS: Joints that can be affected by AMC include the joints in the hands, feet, hips, knees, elbows, shoulders, wrists, fingers, toes, as well as the jaw and the spine. Though all joints can be affected, some may be unaffected as no two people experience the same symptoms; and
- WHEREAS: Though arthrogryposis is not curable, it is treatable. Treatment goals aim to allow those living with the condition as much independence in their daily lives as possible;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, ASA HUTCHINSON, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of Arkansas, do hereby proclaim June 30th, 2017 as

ARTHROGRYPOSIS AWARENESS DAY

across the State, and I encourage my fellow citizens to become more aware of arthrogryposis and the families affected by this condition.
