PROCLAMATION

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME – GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: In the United States, there are approximately 19,000 nurses, including many in Arkansas, working to deliver health and safety programs and services to workers, worker populations, and community groups; and

WHEREAS: Through case management, health counseling, health promotion, wellness activities, legal and regulatory compliance, and workplace hazard detection, occupational health nurses (OHNs) improve the health of workers in Arkansas and the U.S., while contributing to a healthy bottom line for businesses; and

WHEREAS: Because OHNs are employed by manufacturing facilities, healthcare settings, and in workplaces in dozens of other industries throughout the state, employers turn to OHNs to promote healthy lifestyles and keep our workers safe, healthy, and performing at a high level; and

WHEREAS: These OHNs focus on promotion and restoration of health, prevention of illness and injury, and protection from work-related and environmental hazards. OHNs are an important partner in supporting the economic health and competitiveness of the businesses they serve; and

WHEREAS: Occupational Health Nurse Appreciation Week affords us an opportunity to recognize occupational health nurses for the compassionate and dedicated service they provide in keeping the workers of Arkansas safe and healthy;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ASA HUTCHINSON, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of Arkansas, do hereby proclaim April 9th through April 15th, 2018, as
