WHEREAS: The State of Arkansas looks forward to a continued sister-state relationship with Taiwan; and

WHEREAS: On October 10 every year, Taiwan celebrates its independence by observing Double Ten Day, also called National Day. The State of Arkansas joins with Taiwan in recognizing this momentous 107<sup>th</sup> anniversary;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ASA HUTCHINSON, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of Arkansas, do hereby proclaim October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2018, as
