PROCLAMATION

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME – GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: Crosswalk Safety Awareness Day in Arkansas was created 15 years ago in Fayetteville in an effort to protect pedestrians and motorists from harm at crosswalks; and

WHEREAS: In 2016, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), there were 5,987 pedestrians killed by motorists in the United States, and 44 of these were Arkansans; and

WHEREAS: Approximately every 90 minutes, a pedestrian is killed in our country from injuries caused by a traffic accident. One in five deaths involved hit and run drivers, and 70% of those killed were males; and

WHEREAS: By law, drivers are required to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians crossing streets in marked or unmarked crosswalks in most situations; however, pedestrians need to be especially careful at intersections where the driver is turning onto another street, as many drivers fail to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians in their paths; and

WHEREAS: Pedestrians are encouraged to cross the street at designated crosswalks, to stop and look left, right, and left again before crossing, to increase visibility at night by carrying a flashlight and by wearing retro-reflective clothing, and to walk on a sidewalk whenever possible;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ASA HUTCHINSON, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of Arkansas, do hereby proclaim October 10th, 2018, as

CROSSWALK SAFETY AWARENESS DAY

across the State, and I urge my fellow citizens in schools, homes, and offices to discuss crosswalk safety because increasing awareness for safety is positive prevention.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Arkansas to be affixed this 18th day of September, in the year of our Lord 2018.
