**PROCLAMATION**

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME – GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: Although there has been a significant increase in the amount of recycling in Arkansas to date, we must also continue to focus on other initiatives such as waste reduction, composting, the reuse of products and materials, and purchasing recycled products; and

WHEREAS: By encouraging businesses, state agencies, nonprofit organizations, schools, and individuals to celebrate America Recycles Day 2022, we can further promote recycling as an environmentally efficient and economically smart habit; and

WHEREAS: State and community leaders can work together to recycle waste and develop innovative ways to manage our resources more sustainably, and they can also help foster greater awareness of the need to expand collection programs by promoting the benefits to businesses that invest in recycling; and

WHEREAS: Recycling not only preserves our environment by conserving precious resources and reducing our carbon footprint, but it also contributes to job creation and economic development. It is important that all Arkansas citizens learn more about the many recycled and recyclable products available to them as consumers;
