

## PROCLAMATION

## TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME - GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: Smoking remains the single most preventable cause of premature death in our society; and

WHEREAS: Cigarette smoking is responsible for more than 400,000 deaths annually in the United States. Additionally, more than 40,000 nonsmokers die from secondhand smoke exposure; and

WHEREAS: More Americans die every year from tobacco-related diseases than from AIDS, alcohol, car accidents, fires, illegal drugs, murder, and suicides combined; and

WHEREAS: According to research published by the Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids, 20.5 percent of adults in Arkansas are smokers. Over \$1.2 billion are spent annually on health care costs directly related to smoking, of which \$293.1 million is Medicaid spending; and

WHEREAS: For years, millions of smokers have participated in the Great American Smokeout, a day on which they give up cigarettes for 24 hours; and

WHEREAS: Some of those who give up cigarettes for the day may go on to give up the habit entirely; and

WHEREAS: Quitting smoking is proven to improve health, reduce disease burden, and increase longevity; and

WHEREAS: By virtue of the above, the Great American Smokeout, which is held on the third Thursday of November, has potential for improving health;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ASA HUTCHINSON, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of Arkansas, do hereby proclaim November 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022, as

across the State, and I encourage all tobacco users to demonstrate they can quit for the day and perhaps longer.
